EDITORIAL



POSTGRADUATE AND RESEARCH DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The activities of the English Association 2021-22 were inaugurated on 2 July 2021 by Mr Rajesh Chithira, renowned writer and poet. He inaugurated the Association activities for the year and talked extensively on the topic Reading/Pandemic/Literature. The programme was conducted via Google Meet, offline meetings being stifled by the pandemic.

The year long activities of the Association included competitions like movie review writing and online literary quiz. The Department conducted a National Webinar on 17 February 2022 in collaboration with the English Association and MG University, Kottayam. The webinar titled The Posthuman Turn had four sessions, led by four eminent speakers. Dr Prasad Pannian, Editor, Are You Human? (DC Books, 2021) introduced the sessions with his talk A Preface to Posthuman Thinking while Dr Shiju Sam Varghese, Assistant Professor, Centre for Studies in Science, Technology and Innovation Policy, Central University of Gujarat spoke on Posthumanism and the Crisis of Human Sciences. Mr Sambhu R., Assistant Professor, Department of English, NSS College, Pandalam illuminated on Becoming Posthuman and Dr Arunlal Mokeri, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Govt. College, Mokeri elaborated on The Reality of Nature vs. the Nature of Reality. Dr Vineetha S. was the Convenor of the webinar and Mr. Febu George Mathai Kurichiyath

and Dr Teena Rachel Thomas were the Coordinators. The webinar had over two hundred participants and paper presenters from different parts of the state. Dr Teena Rachel Thomas served as the teacher in charge of the Association.

As part of the Extension Activities of the Department, 4 sets of desks and benches worth Rs. 26,000/-were donated to Mar Thoma LP School, Kozhencherry mobilizing funds collected from the students and the staff of the Department. The furniture was handed over to the school in a function in the school premises on 31 May 2022. Dr. Vineetha S. served as the Co-ordinator of the Extension programme.

The Department, in association with the Career Guidance and Placement Cell of the College, collaborated with *Team edlit* to conduct a **30-hour Certificate Course** in IELTS. As a prelude, an Orientation programme titled *IELTS*: Pathway to Your Dreams was conducted on 21 December 2021 by Jijo Varghese and Preethi Mridula Mathew of *Team edlit*. 110 students participated. The IELTS Course was run during February and March 2022. 22 students enrolled and 2 students cleared IELTS. Ms. Susanna Philip and Mr. Thomas Mathew were the coordinators of the Course.





An Interdepartmental Online Cookerv Competition was conducted and 11 students from various departments participated. Application of Cryptography in Scientific Field and the related areas for student projects were also discussed.

The Department, in association with Internal

Quality Assurance Cell of the college, organized a research oriented National Seminar on Differential Equations: Analysis and Applications on 18 December 2021. The seminar was sponsored by The Kerala State Higher Education Council and Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam and was funded by the Management and PTA of the college. The first, second, third, and fourth technical sessions of the seminar were handled by Dr Manil T. Mohan, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics, Dr Arbaz Khan, Assistant Professor, IIT Roorkee, Department of Mathematics, IIT Roorkee, Dr K. The association organized Fresher's Party and Christmas Celebration on 23 December 2021.

The Association conducted a Chess Champion **ship** for the students of our department from 9 March to 16 March 2022. One of the remarkable activities of **Aristoz** 2021-22 was the Power Point Presentation Competition on various topics pertaining to the field of Mathematics and it was a grand success due to the active participation of all the students from DC2, DC3 and PG2 classes. DC3 students were asked to prepare their videos on Famous Curves. PG2 students prepared their videos on Surprising Facts in Mathematics.

Association celebrated Pi-day Intercollegiate Mathematics Fest on 18 March 2022. The programme was inaugurated by Principal Dr Roy George K. Chief guest of the day, Dr Aparna Lakshmanan from the Department of Mathematics, Cochin University served as the quiz master. Through games and puzzles, she lured the students to the magical world of Mathematics. Mathematical Model Presentation and Quiz Competition for college students and Pi Writing Competition for both school and college students were the main attractions of the programme.

The association also gave a wonderful farewell to the final year students and, on 30 May 2022, organized the Association Valedictory Function in which students shared their memorable experiences in the college. POSTGRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS

The Department of Statistics celebrated Environment ■ Day on 5 June 2022 differently through a campaign in which all the students of the department planted saplings in the surroundings of their homes with the aim on spreading importance of planting trees. As the mere knowledge of statistical theory is insufficient to equip students to meet the needs of the fast changing world, the Department later hosted a webinar series on Statistical Tools and Software for Data Analysis. The first webinar in this series was on the topic Introduction to SPSS held on 12 June 2021 and the resource person was Dr. Jubin Antony, Assistant Professor of Statistics, St Aloysius College, Edathua. The second webinar on 19 June 2021 was on the topic Statistical Analysing using **SPSS 1.** The third one was on 3 July 2021, on the topic Statistical Analysis using SPSS II and the resource person was Anitta Susan Aniyan, Research scholar, St Thomas

College, Palai who also handled the fifth webinar on the topic 'Data Analysis Using R'.

As part of the National Statistics Day celebrations on 29 June 2021, a video was uploaded by our students in the department's YouTube channel. In connection with the Talent Day Celebrations, two more videos, Vedhi 2K - part I and II, were uploaded in the channel. Onam was celebrated online and the video was uploaded. The department also took the initiative to celebrate Teacher's Day on 5 September. A workshop Series on Statistical Tools and Data Analysis in Research was conducted from 8 March 2022 to 11 March 2022. 

POSTGRADUATE DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

A Career Guidance class was given to the students on 26 February 2022 and Mr Ashwin B. was the chief guest. The Postgraduate and Research Department of ■ Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry has been consistently interacting with the society, especially to create awareness about the scientific knowledge for solving the problems of farmers and weaker sections of the society. On 15 of July 2021, Karshakamithra an extension activity undertaken by the department of Botany under the auspices of the Central Integrated Pest Management Centre (CIPMC), Ernakulam, offered services and activities for the benefit of the farmers residing in Kozhencherry Panchayat. The first technical session was led by Mr. Milu Mathews, Plant Protection Officer, CIPMC, Ernakulam, Govt. of India, in which the facts, figures and the milestones in the IPM were discussed. The second session was on the problems caused by overuse of herbicides and pesticides in the Agriculture sector by Mr. Tom Cherian, Asst. Plant Protection Officer, CIPMC, Ernakulam. An exhibition of IPM Materials was also organised by the CIPMC team for the farmers.

The activities of the Botany Association for the academic year 2021-22 was formally inaugurated virtually via Google Meet platform on 28 July 2021, by the chief guest Dr. K.M. Prabhukumar, Senior Scientist, CSIR-National Botanical Research Institute, Lucknow. He spoke about the importance of Botany in life and the ways to make a career through studying Botany. The Association also initiated a programme, **Know the Cryptogams** by PG1 students in order to know and study about the lower plant forms and also, **Know the Plant** by PGII students to understand the diversity of higher plant forms.

On the occasion of World Nature Conservation Day, the Association organized a seminar on IUCN: International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources on 28 July 2021. The main objective of the event was to increase awareness about the best practices to conserve our natural resources and encourage

sustainability. The chief guest Dr. K.M. Prabhukumar, Senior Scientist, CSIR-National Botanical Research Institute, Lucknow delivered a speech virtually via Google meet platform, emphasizing the dire need for conserving nature. Students and teachers from other colleges also participated in the seminar.

The Department of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry, in association with IQAC and in collaboration with Spices Board, Kochi organised Vegetos' 2022 on 25 March 2022. Spices Board, Kochi offered services and activities for the benefit of the famers of Pathanamthitta District engaged in cultivation and trade of spices. Dr Joji Mathew, Deputy Director, Spices Board, Kochi delivered a talk on Entrepreneurship Skills in Cultivation Practices and Post-Harvest Technologies of Different Spices. An exhibition of different kinds of spices, their products, value added products etc. was held at the college by the Spices Board team for the farmers and students. Another stall for vegetables and underutilized crops produced by students was also set up.

The Department observed **Ozone Day** on 16 September 2021. As part of the celebration, 26 students participated in the poster designing and pencil drawing competitions based on the theme.

World Soil Day was observed on December 10 2021. It was celebrated to spread awareness among students about the depletion of the soil and search for possible solutions to preserve it. The theme for World Soil Day 2021 was Halt Soil Salinization, Enhance Soil Production.

A seminar was organized on the theme **Research Methodology in Life Sciences** on 14 December, 2021. The primary aim of organizing such a seminar was to equip doctoral scholars, PG and UG students in the Life Science stream for research. Faculty and students from Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Physics and Economics participated in the seminar.

The resource person Prof. Renosh Tom Varghese K. talked about the basics of research.

The department conducted a Skill Development Training Programme on **Mushroom Cultivation** on 18 December 2021, in collaboration with Tropical Institute of Ecological Sciences (TIES), Kottayam.

The Department celebrated **Fresher's Day** on 23 December 2021. **Christmas** was also celebrated on the same day. A cultural programme for students was organized on 23 February, 2022. The main objective of the event was to enhance the confidence level of the students.

National Science Day (NSD) was celebrated by the Department on 28 February, 2022. This year's theme for NSD was Integrative Approach in Science and Technology for a Sustainable Future". The Department of History orga-I nised an Invited Talk on Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel: The Unifier of Modern India' on 30 October 2021 at 11:30 AM to observe the Rashtriva Ekta Diwas (National Unity Day) which is celebrated on 31 October as a tribute to the legacy of this great man. The resource person for the occasion was Dr Harikrishnan S, Assistant Professor and Head of the Department of History at Mahatma Gandhi College, Thiruvananthapuram. It was an informative and comprehensive talk which highlighted the life and achievements of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, whose contributions to the making of modern India is second to none. The Department of History also sought to provide a platform for scholars and historians to offer an insight into the environmental and cultural dimensions of river Pamba, which flows across the Kozhencherry taluk where St Thomas College is located. For this, the Department

organised 4 Day National Workshop on River Pamba: Environmental Dimensions and Cultural Legacy on 17 March to 20 March 2022. The programme was conducted in hybrid mode as the sessions on day one, two and three were held in online format and day four was conducted in offline mode at Juhanon Mar Thoma Hall.

The four day Workshop commenced on 17 March, 2022 with the Inaugural Session presided over by the Principal Dr Roy George K, followed by a session on Megalithic Culture of Pamba River Basin by Dr Ambily Archaeologist, C.S., Assistant Archaeological Survey of India, New river for the tourism sector. Delhi. Day two of the Workshop which fell on 18 March, 2022 began with a session by Dr. M.G Sasibhooshan, a renowned Orator, Writer, Art Historian, & Consultant in Indology on the theme Archaeology of Pamba River Basin.

This session was followed by a

session on Environmental History of the Pamba River Basin by Dr Arun Sasi, Coordinator, Forest Plus 2.0, U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), New Delhi. Dr Sasi's session assessed the impact of colonial policies on the Pamba River Basin and his study was based on colonial records. He also discussed the establishment and history of Travancore Forest Department and examined the adverse impact of 'reserve forests' on the indigenous communities.

On day three, the session was led by Dr Anitha V, Professor and Head, Department of Economics, University Thiruvananthapuram Kerala, whose presentation was on Sabarimala Season and the Conservation of Pamba River. It focused specifically on the problems faced by Pamba especially during the months of November to February Sabarimala Season. Day four, on 20 March 2022, was in offline mode at Juhanon Mar Thoma Hall. The day began with a presentation Aranmula Snakeboat Race: Antiquity and historical Evolutions by Mr. Amrit Raj, Author, Editor and Local Historian. He spoke extensively about the naval heritage of India and the recorded history of the Aranmula snakeboat race in the last two centuries. This was followed by a session on River Pamba: Tourism **Opportunities** by Mr. Satheesh Miranda, Secretary, District Tourism Promotion Council, Pathanamthitta in which he discussed the various opportunities provided by the Pamba

The last session of the workshop was on Bio-treasures on the Pamba River bank: Vegetation linked to **Culture and Environment Protection** by Dr Anju V Jalaj, Assistant Professor, Department of Botany, St. Thomas College, Kozhencherry. Dr

Jalaj focused on the rich herbal wealth of the Pamba river basin and established a close link between the vegetation and the culture of the endogenous people of the area. The Department of History also organized ILLUMINA-ACTION FOR EDUCATION in association with UNAI-ASPIRE to attract and motivate tribal (ST) and Dalit (SC) students to higher education. It was a one-day outreach

MOOC ON ORGANIC FARMING 2021-22

The Massive Open Online Course I (MOOC) on Organic Farming is a novel programme introduced by MG University in accordance with the social initiative of The Government of Kerala to transform Kerala into a selfreliant and eco-friendly state under its 'Haritha Keralam' Mission. It aims to make our society self-sufficient with regard to the production of 'safe to eat vegetables and fruits' and to help develop a positive attitude among students towards organic farming and sustainable agricultural practices.

MOOC on Organic Framing has been introduced by the MG University from the academic year 2020-21 for all DC1 students as an added credit course. Its primary focus is to educate our students in the life-skill of environment-friendly farming techniques by cultivating organic, healthy and nutritious food at home.

As per the directive of the University, all the DC 1 students of 2020-2023 batch were enrolled into the MOOC on Organic Farming programme. A total of 423 students registered from St Thomas College, Kozhencherry. It was also notified that there had to be a college level Coordinator and a Mentor for each Department from every college for the implementation of by the students enrolled in it.

the course. A training programme was conducted by the University for all the Coordinators from the colleges affiliated to MG University. These training videos were then shared by the Coordinator to the Mentors.

For the implementation of this course at our college level, a Committee was formed with Ms. Tania Thomas, Assistant Professor, Department of History as the co-ordinator.

After completing the registration process of students the course officially commenced on 1 May, 2021. This course involved 2 project works and an offline exam which was successfully completed

The participants received certificates issued by IHRD.
